He has held key positions in software engineering at both national and European levels that include the National Computing Centre (UK), the European Software Institute (Spain) and the Centre for Software Engineering (Sweden).

After more than 4 years of public service Peter returned to the private sector in summer 2004 and is now Chairman of Premier Farnell plc and Chairman Elect of Tate & Lyle plc. His other current appointments include chairmanships of two private companies and membership of the council of Imperial College.

Over the past 10 years Peter has led 4 major independent reviews of Public Sector activities: UK Central Civil Government Procurement in 1999; UK Public Sector Efficiency in 2003/4; UK Ministerial & Royal Air Travel in 2005/6; the Australian Government's Use of ICT. He was awarded the CBE in 2000 for services to industry and knighted in 2004 for his work on public procurement.

Paul Ducklin is Head of Technology, Asia Pacific at Sophos in Sydney. He joined Sophos in 1995 from the South African Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (similar to Australia's CSIRO).

Professor Dr Wim Van Grembergen

Wim Van Grembergen is professor at the Economics and Management Faculty of the University of Antwerp (UA), immediate past-chair of the MIS department (UA), and executive professor at the University of Antwerp Management School (UAMS). He teaches information systems at bachelor, master and executive level, and researches in IT Governance issues. His most recent book 'Enterprise governance of IT: achieving strategic alignment and value' (Springer, NY) focuses on the relationship between IT governance practices and business value. Wim is engaged in the continuous development of COBIT and VAL IT and is member of the IT Governance Committee of ISACA.



Sir Peter Gershon CBE FREng

Peter's 40 year career has spanned both the private and public sectors since he graduated in Mathematics at Cambridge University in 1969. After starting in the computer industry (1969-1986) he worked in the telecommunications industry (1987-1994) and then became the main board director in GEC plc in 1994 with responsibility for its UK£4 billion defence business.

Following the sale of GEC's defence business to BAE SYSTEMS in late 1999 he joined the UK Civil Service in April 2000 as the first Chief Executive of the Office of Government Commerce (OGC) with a remit to lead a major programme to reform the way UK Central Civil Government handles over £13 billion p.a. of public procurement. Against an initial target to deliver £1 billion of value for money gains by March 03 the actual achievement

He has worked on various whole of government projects, change management initiatives, taskforces and in line management positions in most departments in the Queensland Government. Tony is also an Adjunct Professor and a member of the Business Information Systems Advisory Committee for the School of Business at the University of Queensland.

John Howarth

John Howarth, Managing Director of Tanner James Management Consultants, is uniquely qualified to comment on the use of best practice methods in Australia. John used early versions of the OGC methods when he worked for the UK Civil Service and UK public sector in the 1980s, then was personally responsible for introducing both PRINCE2 and MSP to the Australian market. John is accredited as a PRINCE2 trainer, PRINCE2 consultant, MSP trainer and MSP consultant, and is accredited to deliver OGC P3M3 assessments. John has personally trained and provided services to hundreds of federal government public servants.



Alistair McGibbon

Often referred to as Australia's former top cyber cop, Alastair MacGibbon is an internationally-respected authority on high-tech crime including internet fraud, consumer victimisation and a range of internet security issues.

Now Managing Partner of Surete Group and founder of the Internet Safety Institute, he advises companies on online trust, and provides thought leadership on internet safety issues.

For over four years prior to that, Alastair headed Trust & Safety and eBay Australia and later eBay Asia Pacific.

Previously Alastair was the founding Director of the Australian High Tech Crime Centre (AHTCC) – a law enforcement unit



hosted by the Australian Federal Police to coordinate Australia's effort to combating serious crime involving technology.

As a Federal Agent with the Australian Federal Police for 15 years he served in numerous roles in Canberra, Sydney and Melbourne before becoming the AFP Overseas Liaison Officer at the Australian Embassy in Washington DC for three years.

Alastair is a graduate of the US Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Academy and has a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of International Studies from the University of Sydney.

Marcus Sachs

Marcus Sachs is Verizon's Executive Director for National Security Policy, working closely with external government and business stakeholders in task forces, working groups, committees, and trade associations as part of the National Security/Emergency Preparedness (NS/EP) community in Washington.



Marcus Sachs' professional experience includes a 20 year military career in the United States Army. He retired from the United States Army in 2001, and was subsequently appointed by the President to serve in the White House Office of Cyberspace Security in 2002-2003, and over four years as a consultant and contractor to the federal government. He has appeared on several domestic and foreign television and radio networks as a computer security expert, and is frequently quoted by the on-line and printed media.

Mr Sachs volunteers as the Director of the SANS Internet Storm Center and as the Corporate Evangelist of the Zeroday Emergency Response Team, serves on the technical advisory council of Secure Elements, the technical advisory board of SAGE Inc., the board of advisors of BrightCloud, Inc. and is a member of the DShield, Inc. board of directors.

Bruce Turner is currently the Chief Internal Auditor at the Australian Taxation Office. He also sits as an independent audit committee member within local government.
